Statement of Cooperation (SOC)

This Statement of Cooperation made as of the Thursday, October 6th, 2011.

Between

The British Columbia Métis Federation

-and-

Métis Veterans Association of British Columbia (MVA-BC)
The "Parties"

Whereas

1. The Métis people are one of the Aboriginal peoples of Canada whose Aboriginal rights are recognized and affirmed by Section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982.
2. The BCMF is recognized as a representative body for the Métis people living in British Columbia.
3. Except as provided herein, the Parties hereto acknowledge the independence and autonomy of one another.
4. The Parties will in a spirit of mutual respect and co-operation, work together on issues that affect the Métis people of British Columbia.
5. The Parties shall establish and maintain open and respectful communications with one another.
6. The relationship between the Parties shall be based on mutual trust and respect consistent with existing Métis community, business and consultation protocols.

Now Therefore the Parties Agree

1. BCMF will support the policy and programming needs of the MVA-BC;
2. The MVA-BC will support membership in the BCMF;



3. The BCMF will invite MVA-BC to all general meetings and ensure communication on a regular basis; *the BCMF will invite an elected MVA-BC member to sit on the BCMF Board of Directors.*
4. The MVA-BC will invite BCMF to meetings and ensure communications on a regular basis;
5. The MVA-BC agrees to participate in any BCMF elections and general meeting;

BCMF Accountably

1. BCMF agrees to hold democratic elections for its directors within two (2) years of its last election; and
2. The BCMF will respect the autonomy of MVA-BC and will ensure that the needs of the MVA-BC are considered when making decisions affecting the MVA-BC.

Term of the SOC

1. This SOC comes into effect as of the date it is fully executed by both parties, and continues until terminated by either Party or until such other date as the Parties may agree to hereafter in writing.
2. Either Party may elect to terminate this SOC upon the provision of sixty (60) days' advance written notice to the other Party.
3. The provisions of this SOC may only be amended by mutual consent and written agreement by the Parties.

Dispute Resolution

1. The Parties are committed to resolving any differences or disputes informally that may arise under this SOC in a timely, practical and respectful manner.
2. If differences or disputes under this SOC cannot be resolved within a reasonable period of time, it will be referred to the President of the MVA-BC and the BCMF President for resolution by them.






