The British Columbia Métis Federation is honoured to support Métis students in pursuing educational opportunities at the post-secondary level. The BCMF Student Scholarship Program provides financial awards to Métis students with full BCMF membership that are enrolled in post-secondary education. Scholarships of \$1,500 are awarded to students who meet all eligibility requirements.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible to be considered for a scholarship, applicants must be:

- » A full BCMF member
- » A permenent resident of BC
- » Registered at a recognized and accredited post-secondary institution in Canada

Ashley DesjarlaisUniversity of British Columbia




Drake HenryBritish Columbia Institute of Technology


Cherisse Klassen
