What is the Co-Developing Community Response project?

The Co-Developing Community Response project is a five year agreement with the Canadian Coast Guard. The goal of the project is to bridge the gap of communication between the Canadian Coast Guard, BC Métis Federation and it's members. The project funds related courses and training for the members of the Coastal Water Protectors.

Who are the Coastal Water Protectors?

The Coastal Water Protectors are comprised of environmentally concerned BC Métis Federation members residing along the British Columbian coastline. The Coastal Water Protectors receive frequent training on emergency management, spill response and management, environmental monitoring and testing, and marine safety.

Coastal Water Protectors project involvement.

The Coastal Water Protectors work to inform BC Métis Federation members and the community on spill response and environmental management by the Canadian Coast Guard and related agencies. The Coastal Water Protectors work to actively engage members of the federation and community on ways to stay informed and continually take part in the project.
