Native Education College (NEC) is a private Indigenous college in Vancouver that works with First Nations and Aboriginal organizations to deliver programs in locations throughout British Columbia. We strive to combine academic excellence with a strong commitment to First Nations community-based education and the best practices of adult education. NEC is currently seeking a Casual Instructor for the following Indigenous Land Stewardship courses:

- ILS 140 - Climate Crises Strategies
- ILS 150 - Indigenous Governance, Law and the Environment
- ILS 160 - Contemporary Issues in Indigenous Land Stewardship
- ILS 170 - Leadership and Program Management

These 3-credit courses develop students' understanding of critical issues involved in land stewardship and environmental knowledge. Students learn how different world views have developed among nations in BC and elsewhere, and how Indigenous knowledge systems can be used as tools for better land management. The curriculum and weekly schedules for online courses match their classroom counterparts, but as online students access the material asynchronously, facilitation duties differ. Preference is for qualified instructors to teach the same classroom and online course.

Qualifications:

Any combination of education and work experience as follows will be considered:

- Bachelor's degree in a related field (Master's degree is preferred);
- Experience using traditional ecological knowledge in the analysis of Indigenous economic, social, political and intellectual issues;
- Significant teaching experience, preferably in post-secondary education;
- Proficiency in delivery of educational content using programs such as Moodle and MS Teams;
- Online experience in asynchronous content delivery (for ILS Online courses)
- Knowledge of Indigenous values, communities and instructional methodology.

Terms:

Appointment to this contract position will require a formal criminal record check, the details of which may preclude finalizing an offer of employment. We welcome all applicants, although Indigenous ancestry is preferred and only short-listed candidates will be contacted. This position is open to male and female applicants.
